
# FOOTBALL (SOCCER) CLINICS

# LEARNING IN YEAR 1/2

As part of our Play Workshop we have been exploring Visual Arts which led to our planned excursion to experience an art gallery. In this newsletter we're excited to share with you the enriching experience the Year 1 and 2 children had at the Canberra Museum and Art Gallery (CMAG), where they explored Sidney Nolan's Ned Kelly paintings in the Nolan Collection Gallery.

## Peek-a-Boo Picture:

During our visit, one of the engaging discussions revolved around the concept of 'hiding' in Nolan's paintings. Questions including, "Is Ned Kelly hiding from Mr Policeman or is Mr Policeman hiding from Ned Kelly?" sparked curiosity and imagination. The children had the chance to express themselves through art by creating Peek-a-Boo Pictures using the wax resist technique with oil pastels and watercolours. This activity allowed them to explore shapes, lines, and storytelling in their artwork.

# **Shape Collage:**

Another captivating discussion focused on Nolan's love for painting shapes and creating patterns with squares, rectangles, circles, spots, and stripes. The children identified shapes and colours in the paintings and collaborated in groups to create patterns with shaped and colourful felt pieces. In the craft area, the artistic journey included making collages using a variety of art materials, allowing them to express their creativity through shapes, colours, sizes, and textures. As well as, shapes of Ned Kelly, gang members, policemen, wombats, magpies and lizards.

### **Monoprint:**

In this unique activity, children explored the world of printmaking through monoprints, a form of printmaking where each image can only be made once. They discussed the characters in Nolan's paintings and observed his use of pattern and bright colours. Inspired by Nolan's style, the children were invited to create colourful Ned Kelly Masks by drawing their designs onto perspex plates with water–soluble crayons. The magic happened when the plate was pressed underneath a piece of dampened and blotted watercolour paper, transferring their designs onto it, creating one–of–a–kind artworks.

We hope you enjoyed hearing about your children's artistic adventures at CMAG and encourage you to continue fostering their creativity at home.
